LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

2024 has been a transformative year for Security & Defence PLuS. The initiative has made significant strides in advancing global security dialogue, applied research, and collaboration, particularly in areas relating to AUKUS, strategic partnerships, and inclusive security, leveraging the collective expertise of three world-leading institutions.

This progress comes against a backdrop of heightened geopolitical tensions, the rapid evolution of emerging technology, and the increasing intersection of security with global challenges such as climate change and economic instability. In the Indo-Pacific region, AUKUS is emerging as a critical pillar of stability, while nations face increasing threats from cyber warfare, hybrid conflicts, and infrastructure disruptions.

In this increasingly complex and volatile landscape, Security & Defence PLuS stands as a vital bridge between academia, government, and industry, equipping stakeholders with the tools to navigate and mitigate emerging security risks.

OUR ACHIEVEMENTS THIS YEAR UNDERSCORE THE POWER OF COLLABORATION AND INNOVATION:

Advancing AUKUS Priorities

We supported research, policy briefs, and advocacy on AI and advanced undersea capabilities, with several initiatives from 2024 still pending and more announcements expected in early 2025.

Fostering Global Dialogue

We convened leaders from government, defence, and academia through events like the Future Security Forum in DC, the Integrated Deterrence Symposium in Phoenix, and the first Athena Series in London to tackle critical security challenges.

Seeding Solutions

S&D+ launched a seed grant initiative to fund innovative, cross-institutional research in areas including cybersecurity, AI, and climate security, promoting collaboration across partner institutions.

We've also significantly grown our team, adding expertise in communications, program management, and strategic leadership to bring fresh energy to tackling today's challenges and advancing our mission.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2025, WE'RE BUILDING ON THIS MOMENTUM WITH AMBITIOUS PLANS:

Education Development

S&D+ will launch new short courses on emerging technologies, leadership, and cross-sector collaboration to equip security professionals with practical skills. Efforts to bring degree programs to market will also continue.

Expanding Seed Grants

We'll increase funding for interdisciplinary projects addressing emerging threats and technologies. A new 'year 2' follow-on grant will support select 2024 recipients in advancing their work towards commercialisation and collaboration.





Seed Grant Awards Announced


4 trilateral projects / 5 bilateral project

The program provided seed funding to nine groundbreaking research initiatives addressing critical challenges in security and defence.

With up to \$15,000 in grants available for trilateral university collaborations and \$10,000 for bilateral projects, the grants are designed to support the very early stages of academic-led research, helping projects establish a foundation for future development and positioning them to seek additional funding.

A series of videos were produced to spotlight these projects, featuring insights from the academics driving them as they outline their focus, proposed solutions, and intended outcomes, offering a glimpse into the future impact of their research.




